The King's School, Canterbury

The King's School has its roots in the sixth century and its pupils live and work within the inspirational and ancient Precincts of Canterbury Cathedral and the grounds of St Augustine's Abbey. Music has played a central role in the school's life from its monastic foundations.

The Crypt Choir form the school's senior choir with its primary purpose to provide music for weekly services in the Canterbury Cathedral, of which the King's School is part of its Foundation. The choir also performs at outside venues most recently St Paul's, Knightsbridge, The Temple Church, St John's, Smith Square and Westminster Abbey. They have toured extensively, including New York, Boston, New Zealand, Australia and Hong Kong.

The Choir reached the final stage of the 2005 BBC Choir of the Year at the Lowry Centre in Salford. In July of that year the Choir were invited to perform Tallis' *Spem in alium* alongside The Sixteen and Harry Christophers in Canterbury Cathedral. This concert will mark the launch of their latest CD, *A Spotless Rose*.
